Course Description:

Roanne Hill, master Crow language teacher at St. Labre Indian Catholic High School, will guide participants in creating classroom lesson plans and demonstrating methods for teaching the Science and Natural World picture book series, and the Crow Level 2 textbook. Participants will also demonstrate the audio components, assessment tools, and games from the newly revised *Bíluukaalilaah! Speak Crow! Level 2* textbook that includes vocabulary and conversation acquisition. A strong emphasis will be placed on the practice of reading and writing the Crow language and incorporating the Crow Dictionary into lesson plans.

Cultural Relevant Activity:

All language classes are inscribed in a cultural context, since language, by its nature, reflects and shapes the culture that it expresses. As needed, students will have access to computer labs on campus.
