Roanne Hill, master Crow language teacher at St. Labre Indian Catholic High School, will guide participants in incorporating this series of picture books into the K-12 Crow Language Curriculum. Workshop participants will develop lesson plans with learning activities that expand across different grade levels and academic disciplines. Participants will also develop assessment tools (via the eLearning Platform) to measure student acquisition of Apsáalooke language and content learning from book series.
