Robert Rugh, Director of Crow Language Operations at The Language Conservancy, will introduce the beta form of the interactive Ammiláau Crow Language eLearning platform for adaptation into the K-12 classroom. The eLearning platform is intended to supplement classroom instruction for Crow language teachers and students, or for independent study. The first year beta version includes Levels 1 and 2 textbook vocabulary, conversational lessons, and interactive exercises. There will be the opportunity for each participant to individually use, practice and model both the learner interface and the teacher's portal and to also provide valuable input and feedback to adapt the platform for the Crow language classroom.
